



# Web Client: Browser Shortcuts


These shortcut commands work in both Chrome and Firefox browsers.

## Browser Keyboard Shortcuts

Open a New Tab	<b>CTRL + T</b>
Close Current Tab	<b>CTRL + W</b>
Undo Close Tab (open last closed tab)	<b>CTRL + SHIFT + T</b>
Open a Link in a New Tab	<b>CTRL + Click on Link</b>
Navigate Between Tabs	<b>CTRL + TAB</b>
Switch to the First Tab	<b>CTRL + 1</b>
Switch to the Last Tab	<b>CTRL + 9</b>
Navigate To Top of Page	<b>HOME</b>
Navigate To Bottom of Page	<b>END</b>
Reload the Current Page	<b>F5 or CTRL + R</b>
Stop Loading the Current Page	<b>Esc</b>

## Browser Navigation Using the Mouse



### Open a New Tab

Chrome	Firefox
Use the upper right menu (three dots) to select New tab  New tab New window New incognito window Ctrl+T Ctrl+N Ctrl+Shift+N	Click the plus sign next to the current browser open tab. 

### Open a Link in a New Tab

To open a link from the web client right-click the link and select **Open Link in New Tab**. Using this method, you can also open options from the web client's dropdown menus in a new tab

For example, Click Search top menu, right click on Search for Patrons, select open link in a new tab.

### Right Mouse Click Behavior in a Grid (table of data)

This is the expected/intended behavior in the web client. There are a few screens/interfaces that do not behave this way and bugs have been filed:

- Right clicking on a link in a grid opens the context menu, giving options to open link in a new tab, open in a new window, copy link, etc.

- Right clicking in a grid row anywhere other than on a link opens the Actions menu.
